What is the 1912 Legacy Society?

Fourth Presbyterian Church established the 1912 Legacy Society to honor those who have made a lasting commitment to our congregation by including charitable gifts to the Church in their estate plan. Any member who notifies the church that they have a planned gift, of any amount, designated for the church is a member of the 1912 Legacy Society.

The 1912 Legacy Society is an opportunity for you to leave a faith legacy to Fourth Presbyterian to help ensure the work of Jesus Christ continues for generations to come. This faith legacy can be part of your estate or overall financial planning.



How will your gift be used?

You can designate how you want your legacy gift to be used. Here are some examples:

- Perpetual Pledge Fund – a special fund used to help support the church's annual mission and operations.
- Designated Endowment Funds – These include Christian Education, Mission and Outreach, Congregational Care, Buildings and Grounds, Youth, Pellett-Wearn Series, Seminary Students Support, and Little Folks.
- Unrestricted Endowment Fund – used to support special programs in the church that are over and above the annual budget; undesignated gifts are allocated to this account
- Any special program, mission or recognized need in the church

Do I have to commit to a specific gift amount?

No, in fact you do not have to designate the planned amount details of your gift. You only have to indicate your intention to leave a faith legacy. That said, any information of your desire helps the Church administer the gift the way you intend.

How do I become a member?

If you would like to become a member of the 1912 Legacy Society, we would be delighted to meet with you. If your estate plan has been completed, simply notify us of your plans to leave a gift to Fourth Presbyterian Church. A form is available through the church office.

How will I be recognized?

All members of the 1912 Legacy Society will be recognized annually on a special Sunday at the church. In addition, those members who have made a faith gift to the church will be recognized in a special way following their death. If you would like to make a gift but would prefer not to be named, you may request to be listed as anonymous.
